Prerequisite: Enrolled in the Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine
BCC 7XXX	<u>Family Medicine Geriatric Clerkship</u> 2 credits The 2013 class will be divided in 2 groups. Each group will be going to Leon Medical Centers approximately twice a month on Mondays from September 2010 to February 2011. Students will be assigned a rotation schedule and are expected to attend a meeting at the Leon Medical Centers to meet his/her preceptor prior to the start of the rotation and to confirm the location, date, and other issues specific to the site. At each Center, students will have the opportunity to attend outpatient clinic, wound care, walk-in clinic, physical therapy, and dermatology clinic. During the rotation, students will also attend Geriatric Core lecture series and discussion of clinical cases at the COM. Students are also required to present a brief discussion of a relevant clinical topic during their Geriatric clerkship. This presentation will be delivered to the faculty and other medical students during the geriatric clerkship. The Second Period Geriatric Clerkship will provide students with an experience in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of geriatric patients in the outpatient setting. Throughout patient clinical experiences, students will be exposed to a wide variety of geriatric patients presenting with acute illnesses, chronic illnesses, evaluation of disabilities and preventive health maintenance visits. Students will participate in clinical evaluations, simulated cases, simulated laboratory scenarios, and didactic lectures. The clerkship emphasizes comprehensive assessment and management of core common geriatric conditions. Prerequisite: Enrolled in the Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine
BMS 6XXX	<u>Evidence-Based Medicine</u> 1 credit This course is intended for students to acquire and develop both the knowledge and the skills for evidence-based medicine (EBM). The emphasis of the course is on the second, third and four steps of EBM: searching clinical evidence, appraising critically the validity and importance of clinical research evidence, and determining the applicability of evidence into practice. This course content complements the previous activities addressing EBM (BMS 6881) where the students learned how to develop answerable clinical (PICO) questions from patient's problems. In addition, during this course students will use concepts obtained in previous epidemiology courses as they are applied to help solving clinical problems. The course is divided in two major and consecutive workshops: 1) how to search the clinical evidence, and 2) how to appraise the validity, the importance and the applicability of the evidence. Prerequisite: Enrolled in the Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine
BMS 6XXX	<u>Professional Behavior I</u> 1 credit Professional Behavior I is a course with Professional Development designed to introduce and teach awareness of certain values, emotions and attitudes, behaviors and self-reflection to the medical student. This course applies the philosophy and general understanding for emotionally preparing the future physician for the many diverse psychological experiences associated with the clinical setting and professional life. Specifically, to have an understanding and awareness of one's behavioral and personal issues, the emotional stress found in practicing medicine, and how these can impact patient care and health outcomes. Prerequisite: Enrolled in the Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine

BMS 6XXX Professional Behavior II 1 credit
 This course is a continuation of the Period One Professional Behaviors experience. Where the focus of the course during Period One was on “self-awareness,” Period Two goes more into depth in the development of self-awareness and the developing of the emerging “MD Identity.” Class sessions are structured using the same approach with the introduction, history, development and implications of the Values, Emotions, or Attitude (VEA) on medical practice. However, the vignettes are more evidence-based and discussions include reflections of the student’s clinical experiences as they relate to the VEA. Additionally, the VEAs presented in the class session are more comprehensive and identify greater implications for the MD.

- PHC 6XXXC Evidence-based Health Policy for Public Health 3 credits
This course examines the relationship between scientific evidence and public policy in a population health context. Mechanisms for advancing evidence-based health policy are explored.
