New Graduate Track: MS in Chemistry with Report Option presented by Watson J. Lees.

- Proposal to allow students to be awarded the Masters en-route to the Ph.D.
- Proposed to make the distinction that MS degrees in Chemistry usually require a thesis.
- Students may also apply directly to this program without the more formal thesis.
- Students eligible to select this degree only after they have advanced to candidacy.
- Number of students choosing this option is expected to be quite low.
- Correct proposal to indicate that students are admitted in Fall & Spring terms only.

New Graduate Degree: Master of Science in Logistics Engineering presented by Chin-Sheng Chen.

• Program proposed to fulfill need expressed by the community & Beacon Council.

- Other degrees are currently offered and we have been tasked to propose a degree for many years.
- Students in Bachelors degree working in the field would benefit from this program.
- Miami is an important logistics hub for the US & Latin America.
- Discussion ensued regarding that all the core courses are offered only in the fall term. Department may review when they are offered in the future.
- Recommended that the course plans be less rigid to allow students more flexibility for completion of the degree.
- No required capstone course, but students may select to complete a final project.
- Professional outcomes are assessed by the students & employers by survey and built into the entire curriculum.
- Currently recruiting one more faculty member.
- Collaborating with industry partners in the community.

## Discussion - Credits from certificate courses that can be applied to Master's degree

Eric Dwyer, College of Education

- Professional Graduate Certificate are congruent to 6 courses of the Masters program.
- Policy currently limits certificate transfer to 12 credits.
- Certificate students may end up taking more courses than Masters student.
- Courses in Certificate & Masters are exactly the same courses.
- Certificates now must be standalone certificates with learning outcomes.
- B or higher in each course to transfer the courses into the Masters.
- May change the policy or grant an exception to the program.
- Program will petition an exception to the policy from the Graduate School to accept coursework with a grade of B into the Masters program.
- Applies to the Graduate Certificate Program in TESOL & Spanish Bilingual Certificate

Update from the Andres Gil, Vice President of Research

- Continue to work on reviewing police & procedures.
- Working on meeting with department staff on December 11 and working to streamline systems & procedures.
